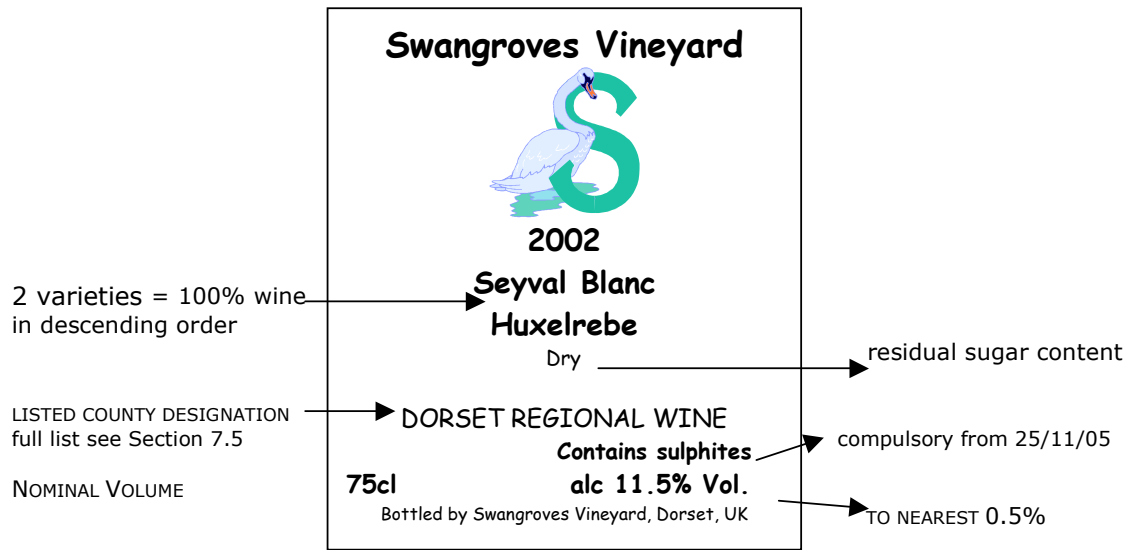

Regional (Table) Wine



Regional Wine is an ‘upper’ category of Table Wine (equivalent to French Vin de Pays etc.) The minimum natural alcohol is 6% and minimum actual alcohol is 8.5% (see Table / Regional / Quality Wines, - a summary of the parameters). 85% of the wine must originate from grapes grown in the stated region.

A list of regions is set out in the Notice to Growers (see newpage of the website).

In other respects Regional Wine must comply with the requirements set out for Table Wine. See *EU Still wine regulations* (Guide to the Law section).

2. Quality Wine psr (QWpsr)

Labelling requirements are as required for other QWpsr set out in *EU Still wine regulations*

- Welsh Vineyards
